Principal Message- Mr. Runco




Looking ahead, we are excited for several upcoming events:

Dear ECSD Families,

This evening, the Alberta Teachers' Association (ATA) announced that members have voted against ratifying the tentative agreement with the Teachers' Employer Bargaining Association (TEBA). Without an accepted deal, the ATA has indicated that teachers will begin strike action on Monday, October 6.

We recognize that this news may raise questions and concerns for families. At this time, there are no changes to classes or school operations. Students should attend school as usual on Wednesday, October 1.

If a strike begins, there will be no classes starting Monday, October 6. Families are encouraged to arrange childcare in advance.

More information will be shared on October 1. Edmonton Catholic Schools will communicate directly by email and update the Labour Update webpage as new details become available. We remain hopeful that a resolution will be reached and are committed to supporting students and families through this period of uncertainty.

Off Campus Education Spotlight

Off Campus Education provides students at St. FX opportunities to explore and expand their career interests and aptitudes in meaningful activities, situated in community-based work sites, and volunteer agencies.

Off Campus Education at St. FX is a flexible program offered in 2 main streams: Work Experience and RAP (Registered Apprenticeship Program)

Work Experience

Students have an opportunity to discover their career interests in meaningful work activities, situated in community-based work sites in business, industry, government, and community service. Work Experience is time based: 25 hours of work, equals one credit, and is available with the following credit options:

- Work Experience 15 3 to 10 credits
- Work Experience 25 3 to 10 credits
- Work Experience 35 3 to 10 credits





Registered Appreciation Program-RAP Spotlight

RAP students are placed onto worksites that have designated journeyman supervisors/employers. Students within this program can earn up to 40 high school credits in the program. RAP students also earn up to 1000 hours in a skilled trade and earn money as a first year apprentice in one of Alberta's designated trades.

Applications for Post Secondaries across the country open October 1st, so please make sure that you have your mypass and applyalberta accounts are ready to go before applying.





Truth
From 21 Things You May Not Know About the Indian Act



- 1. It denied women status
- 2. Introduced residential schools
- 3. Created reserves
- 4. Renamed people with European names *without their consent
- 5. First Nations people had to receive permission to leave the reserve
- 6. To attend university, First Nations people had to give up their rights
- 7. Land that was provided through treaty negotiations could be taken away if the government decided they needed it.
- 8. It denied First Nations people to a lawyer, and it did not allow any lawyers to help First Nations people.
- 9. It forbade First Nations people from speaking their native language.
- 10. It forbade First Nations people from practicing their religion or ceremonies.
- 11. First Nations needed a permit to sell any products from their farms.
